"Second Chances" follows six union members
--two from the IBEW, two from the Ironworkers,
and two from the Pipe Trades-- as they emerge
from a prison life preceded by violent gang
membership. With an opportunity to learn a trade
that will keep them off the streets and earning
a living wage, the film follows them at work, at
home, with their families, and in their apprenticeship programs. An inspiring story of hope and
